

We have had another successful year with Haven Distribution able to supply 1,451 educational books & dictionaries across much of the prison estate. This is an increase of over 12% on the previous year. We have managed this despite the Book Ban still being in force during this period.

We were absolutely delighted to receive not one but two anonymous donations of $\pounds 10,000$ each which has given us the opportunity to reach out to more prisoners in buying books for their studies. I would like to personally thank those two individuals for choosing to support Haven.

April 2014 saw us move in to our new office. A big thank you to all those who gave up their time to help us move a huge number of books and office equipment to our new address. Haven Distribution has no paid staff so we depend on the generosity of individuals committed to ensuring that our vital service continues.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT to the Trustees of HAVEN DISTRIBUTION on the accounts for the year ended 31 MARCH 2015

I have examined the accounts on pages 2 to 5 which have been prepared on the basis of the accounting policies set out on page 4.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The trustees of the charity are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. They consider that an audit is not required for this year, under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act"), and that an independent examination is needed.

As independent examiner it is my responsibility to:

- (1) Examine the accounts under section 145 of the Act;
- Follow the proceedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act;
- (3) State whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Examiner's Statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the accounts.

Independent Examiner's Statement

In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention:

- (1) Which gives me reasonable cause to believe that, in any material respect, the trustees have not met the requirement to ensure that:
- (2) Proper accounting records are kept; and
- (3) Accounts are prepared which agree with the accounting records and comply with the accounting requirements of the Act; or
- (4) To which in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

1) ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(A) Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historic cost and in accordance with:

- Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005)
 the Charities Act 2011
- 2016 2014

(B) Incoming Resources

Incoming Resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources, the trustees are certain they will receive the resources, and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability. Legacies, grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable. Gifts in kind and donated services and facilities are not given an estimated value in the accounts. Volunteer help is not given any value in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

(C) Tangible Fixed Assets

There were no fixed assets of any material value purchased during the year or owned by the charity at the year end.

(D) Reserves & Funds

The accounts distinguish between restricted and unrestricted funds: Restricted funds are received from donors and are subject to restrictions on the purpose for which they may be used. The costs of raising, spending and administering those funds are charged against each fund.

Unrestricted funds are those where there are no externally imposed restrictions. These include those freely available to the Charity for expenditure or appropriation to reserves for general charitable purposes.
